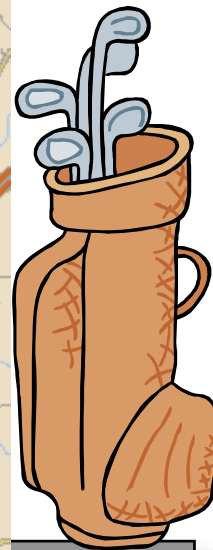
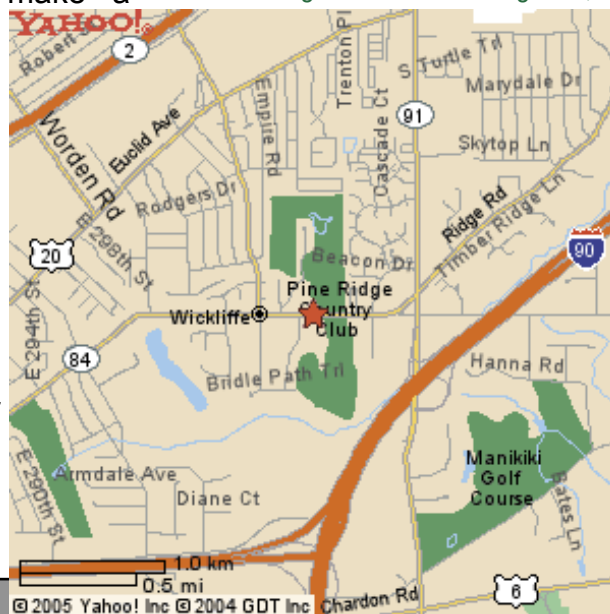

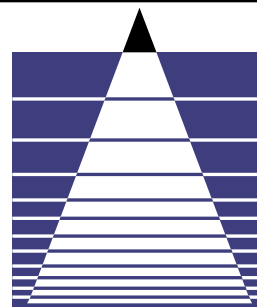

Granted, some people are filling dual roles, but I wanted to get our future leaders involved early. I think it's working, we even have a couple past leaders in our section coming back to help!

I'd like to thank my officers, board of managers and chairpersons, we have a good group here in Cleveland, and I think it will be even stronger next year. The new slate is official as of July 1st. Besides our new president Dyke Riffle, the rest of the slate will be announced at the golf outing. I'd like to challenge the new leadership to continue the ideals we have started. I would also encourage them to focus on education – and our new education chair is off to a great start by not only planning for a fall ED-150 course, but already having people signed up for it! Membership will also be a new section commitment. Our new membership chair is a self-proclaimed hunter, not a gatherer, so watch out if you are not currently a member of IES, he will find you!

Finally, I want to mention the unique opportunity the Society's big centennial, next January, presents for local section participation. As you read about the activities we have done and are going to be doing in our section, and they will be actually occurring throughout the entire 2006 calendar year, those of you who really want to become involved in IES do not have a better time to do so than right now.
