### Lighting

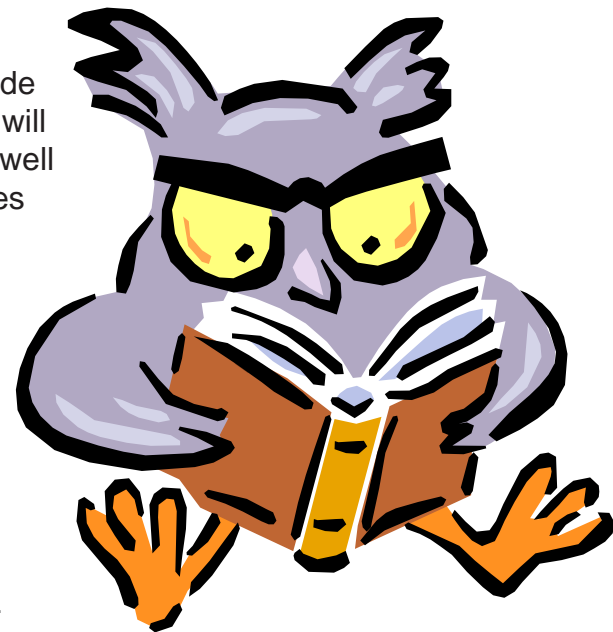
