

Light & Color: Understanding Color Preference and Evolving Color Metrics



Color is a hot topic right now in the lighting industry, particularly with the customizability of LEDs. The inadequacy of our traditional metrics, such as CCT and CRI, to evaluate and reflect the quality of LED products has become increasingly apparent. Several alternative color metrics have been proposed recently, including

TM-30-15, in an attempt to more accurately capture lighting quality. Hear an overview of the Light+Color Symposium from April 3–5 in Gaithersburg, Maryland, and learn about some of the latest developments in color metrics and color preference, accompanied by a side-by-side color booth demonstration.

Kevin Vick is a Lead Design Engineer with Current, powered by GE, in Cleveland, Ohio. Kevin has been with GE for 6 years and has quickly developed into an up-and-coming expert in color science. He works on the innovation team in technology, with a focus on the perception of light and understanding lighting preference.
